



### **Dear Friends & Supporters,**





It's an honor to share Kingsley House's FY 2020-2021 annual report. During a period marked by a global pandemic, economic uncertainty and other major societal challenges, Kingsley House's staff, leadership team, and board of directors overcame obstacles of uncommon proportions, developed creative programmatic solutions and seamlessly transitioned the provision of core services through the various stages of the COVID-19 crisis. Daily temperature screenings, advanced cleaning, sanitation practices, and strict visitor and movement management policies helped keep everyone safe across all of our campuses.

#### **KEY MOMENTS AND MILESTONES**

Our **EARLY LEARNING SERVICES** went from virtual programming to hybrid instruction to full, in-person learning for more than 700 infants, toddlers, preschoolers and their families, always focused on ensuring continued growth and development of the children and enabling parents to remain in the workplace.

- Eighty-two (82) preschoolers successfully transitioned to Kindergarten, and our Parents as Educators homebased early childhood education program continued to provide prenatal services for expecting moms, and early childhood development for families with children from birth to three years of age.
- To further enhance learning experiences, and cultivate children's critical thinking skills, all staff were trained in STEM, while children's learning of the visual and performing arts continued through partnerships with New Orleans Museum of Art Mini-Master's program and Young Audiences of Louisiana.
- Additional supports were also provided throughout the year to parents and caregivers, including Triple P Positive
  Parenting, one of the most effective evidence-based parenting programs in the world. Triple P gives parents
  simple and practical strategies to help them build strong, healthy relationships, confidently manage their
  children's behavior, and prevent problems from developing.

Throughout the year, we continued to remotely serve our most vulnerable seniors, veterans and medically fragile adults. Our **KINGSLEY ADULT DAY CARE** team provided high-quality in-home and virtual services to ensure the physical and mental health of program participants.

- Our staff was constantly called upon to be creative while center-based programming was not possible, providing regular in-home wellness checks, a robust meal home-delivery program, supplying arts and crafts materials and holding online classes.
- The staff also celebrated Veterans Day with a drive by parade to the homes of our Veterans, hand delivered Christmas gifts to all of our participants, and even held a mini-Mardi Gras parade where caregivers and participants drove around the agency.
- When center-based services were allowed to resume on our Patrick F. Taylor Campus in June 2020, staff
  reimagined the facility to maintain social distancing, creating vibrant spaces for productive, and safe, social and
  developmental activities.
- The Center is once again thriving, serving 100 seniors, veterans and medically-fragile adults from throughout the greater New Orleans area. We are happy to report that 100% of our adult day care staff and 99% of participants are fully vaccinated.

Our **COMMUNITY & SUPPORTIVE SERVICES PROGRAM** (CSSP) was a critical resource for families at the Columbia Parc, Heritage Senior Residences, Faubourg Lafitte, and Sacred Heart at Saint Bernard residential communities.

• From providing volunteer income tax assistance, to hosting mobile vaccine drives, serving hot meals for seniors, and assisting with emergency rental aid as needed, CSSP offered comprehensive, community-based services that helped nearly 2,000 individuals successfully manage through the pandemic and continue to build social and economic capital.

**KINGSLEY CONNECTIONS** was an essential component of our work, providing 200 individuals with job readiness training, post-secondary education and employment opportunities in living wage careers within high demand and emerging industries.

• Thanks to collaborative and strategic partnerships with fellow human service organizations, training providers, and employers, Kingsley Connections played a pivotal role in building the talent pipeline for regional healthcare organizations on the front lines of the COVID crisis.

Finally, as we prepared to move into our organization's 125th anniversary year, we announced that we will be changing our name to one that reflects our values and vision for the children, families, and community we serve. Our board and leadership team are honored by the support we have received in this process, and look forward to continuing our high impact, life transforming work under our new banner, expected to be announced in 2022.

**THANKS TO YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT,** Kingsley House's legacy of service is solidly positioned for the next 125 years. We move forward with a strong commitment to broaden our advocacy and programmatic efforts with bolder initiatives of equity and inclusion so that all families in our community have the opportunity to emerge stronger and better together.
