


In Memoriam: Sheldon "Skip" Brechtel

At Clover, we believe that every child deserves the chance to thrive, every family deserves the support they need, and every community deserves the opportunity to flourish. That conviction continued to drive our work throughout Fiscal Year 2023–2024 and shape our vision for a stronger, more accessible Greater New Orleans region.

In FY 2023-2024, Clover deepened and broadened its service to more than 8,000 individuals and families across our early learning, youth, adult day care, workforce development, and resident engagement programs and services. Together with our board, staff, partner agencies, and—most importantly—the families we serve, we've continued to evolve our services to meet the moment, while remaining grounded in our mission and core values.

This year brought several transformative milestones:

- We launched a bold new strategic plan that prioritizes participant power and voice, deepened partnerships, and an enhanced whole family, multi-generational approach.
- We were selected by the Kresge Foundation as one of only four New Orleans organizations to join its 2Gen Learning and Action Institute—an opportunity that will accelerate our multi-generational work and strengthen outcomes for the whole family.
- We secured a nearly \$500,000 investment from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation to establish Clover's new CORE (Collaborative of Resources and Empowerment) Hub, which is a first-of-its-kind initiative to unite community-based organizations in holistic, family-centered supports.

These initiatives reflect our unwavering belief that when we help move families forward, the entire community rises with them.

As we look to the future, we also want to recognize the leadership that has guided us here. Fiscal Year 2023–2024 marked the conclusion of Chimène Grant Saloy's service as Board President. Chimène helped lead Clover through a transformative period of our name rebrand and expanded vision for impact. We are grateful for her extraordinary leadership and enduring commitment.

As Louisiana's second-largest Head Start grantee,

Early Learning Services delivers the state's most comprehensive and diverse early learning model to more than 2,000 infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and their families each year. Through a robust network that includes

Clover Academy's two campuses, Educare New

Orleans and 10 high-quality childcare provider partners across Orleans and Jefferson Parishes, Clover ensures that families can access early education and wraparound supports where and how they need them most.

Across Clover's center-based and home-based Parents as Educators program settings, families receive high-quality, high impact early learning, health and developmental screenings, and seamless connections to critical resources. These services do more than prepare children for kindergarten—they create pathways for families to grow, achieve, and thrive together.






Meet TYESHA, Parents as Educators participant

Clover Cares: Dignity, Joy, and Connection—Every Day



Clover Cares Adult Day Care ensures medically fragile adults, seniors and veterans, and those who are developmentally challenged have the supports they need to remain healthy, active and connected.

As the only Adult Day Care program in Greater New Orleans with a Veterans Administration referral contract and largest single site in the state, Clover Cares provides year-round, compassionate care for more than 100 participants—including over two dozen veterans. Our holistic, hands-on approach promotes health, dignity, and independence, helping families care for their loved ones while giving participants the opportunity to engage, connect, and thrive in their own homes and community.

Meet ARTHUR,

a proud Clover Cares participant

At 86 years young, Mr. Arthur brings spirited charm and a lifetime of service to Clover's Adult Day Care community. A proud New Orleans native and the eldest of four, Mr. Arthur served for a decade in the U.S. Army before building a long and successful career at Blue Cross Blue Shield.

Today, he remains active through his love of music and social connection, lighting up Clover each day and even working part-time at the Saenger Theatre.

"Clover Cares keeps me busy, and I enjoy talking with my peers," he says with a grin, reflecting the power of staying mentally and socially engaged.

Earlier this year, Mr. Arthur was crowned Clover King IV at our annual Mardi Gras Ball, a joyful reminder that age is no barrier to living fully and celebrating life.

links hundreds of parents, caregivers, and community residents each year to valuable entry-level and advanced certifications in living-wage careers—including healthcare, commercial driving, office administration, facilities

maintenance, and more.

In FY 2023-2024, Clover served as a lead partner in the Where Are the Workers? – Greater New Orleans (WATW) initiative, a regional effort to strengthen the workforce development ecosystem across Orleans and Jefferson Parishes.

Building on the momentum of Clover's 2021 Together, Stronger, Better convening, WATW brought together nonprofit leaders, funders, public officials, training providers, and employers to identify solutions that expand access, equity, and support for job seekers.

As momentum continues, Clover remains firmly at the table—advancing collaborative, community solutions that help families not only survive, but truly thrive.

Resident Engagement:



Strengthening Communities from Within



Clover provides wraparound support and community-based services for families and seniors living in the Columbia Parc, Heritage Senior Residences, and River Garden residential communities. From case management and career training to emergency assistance and legal aid, our Resident Engagement Program helps individuals connect to the tools and resources they need to reach their goals.

This year:

- 153 families accessed critical resources like workforce training, utility and rental assistance, health and mental health supports, tax preparation assistance and financial literacy/asset building coaching.
- 250+ residents participated in community-building activities from senior fitness challenges and movie nights to family holiday meals and seasonal festivals.



At River Garden, a young mother enrolled in Clover Career Connections' job training program, earned her health care certification and is now working a living wage full-time job with benefits. At Columbia Parc, a senior citizen received a Thanksgiving food basket through a coordinated opportunity with New Orleans Saints player Johnathan Abrams, and was grateful for the dignity and connection it provided. Through Clover's free VITA tax preparation service, a young father received his earned income tax credit and refund,

which gave him the power to catch up on bills and purchase school supplies for his children, right when it mattered most.

These experiences are reminders that when Clover is present in a neighborhood, so is possibility and a pathway forward for families.





Outcomes and Outputs

- 8,000+ Individuals and Families Served
- 2,200 Infants, Toddlers, Preschool aged children and their families received comprehensive early learning services and supports
- 1,800 individuals and their families living in Columbia Parc and
 River Garden residential communities had access to comprehensive
 community and supportive services
- 5 150 people received career development, job training and advancement services
- 613 families and seniors received nutrition assistance, financial coaching, and access to community resources to achieve their life goals
- 110 medically fragile adults, seniors, veterans and individuals with developmental disabilities, attended Clover Cares Adult Day Care
- 108 children successfully transitioned from Clover Academy early learning to kindergarten, with more than 90% fully prepared cognitively, physically, socially and behaviorally to thrive.
- 373 families and seniors received volunteer tax assistance services (VITA), totaling \$521,496 in federal refunds, maximizing available tax credits and saving an average \$273 in tax preparation services fees
